## **Certified Medication Aide (CMA)** - 56 HR

#### PREREQUISITE:

Current CNA card; 6 months experience as CNA/ Long-Term Care/CNA; proficient in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English; 10th grade math level proficiency.

Free proficiency exam available @ www.testpreview.com/tabepractice.htm This course is designed to prepare students to safely administer medications to residents in nursing homes or adult day care centers. Students are taught the proper procedures of medication administration, therapeutic and adverse effects of medication, legal responsibilities, ethical conduct to follow, charting and reporting skills and the knowledge and skills necessary to identify and provide proper services to a patient. The 40 hours of classroom and laboratory work includes 8 hours of Basic Life Support - Health Care Provider CPR training for certification. Clinical hours, usually on a weekend, are arranged by the instructor and differ from regular classroom hours. Upon successful completion of this course, students are eligible to take the written exam\* approved by the Oklahoma State Health Department. Students must have current background check and current immunization record with current TB shot record for the clinical portion.\*\*

## **CNA/Home Health**

## Long-Term Care/ Certified Nurse Aide - 112 HR

This course focuses on safe and effective provisions of patient care. Classes include: communication, body functions, body mechanics, patient needs, infection control, personal care, safety, special procedures, vital signs, emergency care and first aid/ CPR. This course prepares students to take the state skills and written certification tests for Long-Term Care/CNA. Fees for the state exams may be paid at the time of testing,

which is after all course work is successfully completed. Students must pass the state clinical examination before they may take the state written examination. Two forms of ID are required before taking the examination. Clinical hours, usually on a weekend, are arranged by the instructor usually at times different from the classroom hours. Students must have current background check and current immunization record with current TB shot to attend the clinical portion.\*\*

## Security/Handgun Training

## Security Phase I & II, Unarmed **40 HR**

Phase I is required for all forms of security guard licenses. Instruction includes: interpreting the Oklahoma Security Guard and Private Investigator Act, developing first aid skills, operating fire fighting equipment, writing field notes, writing reports and interpreting legal powers and limitations. Phase II is related to the tasks of unarmed security guards. Students receive instruction in public relations, performing fixed post duties, patrolling and investigating security incidents. After successfully completing Phase I and II students must take the Phase I and II CLEET test before receiving a security guard license. Test fee: \$25. The minimum age requirement is 18 years. Attendance during all class sessions required.

## Security Phase III, Private Investigator - 39 HR

#### PREREQUISITE: Phase I & II

Phase III of security training is related to the tasks of private investigators. Students receive instruction in understanding responsibilities to clients, interpreting laws of private investigations, complying with the Fair Credit Reporting Act, conducting investigations/ surveillance and locating and communicating information. The minimum age requirement is 18 years. Attendance during all class sessions required. Phase III students must take the Phase III CLEET test before receiving a license. Test Fee: \$25

#### PREREQUISITE: Phase I & II

Students must have the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory, Long Version, on file before enrolling in this class. Students receive instruction in handgun safety, nomenclature and maintenance, fundamentals of marksmanship, handgun handling skills, handgun shooting positions, range procedures and legal issues. Students supply their own ammunition. The minimum age requirement is 21 years. Attendance during all class sessions required. Firearm students must take the Phase IV CLEET test before receiving a license. Test Fee: \$25 -Maximum Enrollment - 10 Students

Students supply their own ammunition. The minimum age requirement is 21 years. Attendance during all class sessions required. Maximum Enrollment - 10 Students



## Residential/Commercial HVAC Technician - 48 HR

This course taught by daytime instructor, Mitchell Thomas, will specialize in Refrigeration System Components. The components are compressors, evaporators, condensers and metering devices. After taking this class students should have obtained the basic knowledge and understanding of an air conditioning and refrigeration refrigerant cycle. There is no required textbook for this class as the entire class will be hands-on learning in a lab setting.




